# Mayor's Message

With the change of the seasons, we are seeing a great number of new potholes on Borough streets. This happens every spring and our Department of Public Works is now taking an inventory of our streets and will be addressing the potholes on an as needed basis. In addition to the patching of potholes by our DPW staff, the Borough has an aggressive road improvement program this spring involving the following streets:

Comanche Drive Phase2 - Mohican to Genesse (or Genesee depending on which sign you read)

Shore Road - entire street

Gooseneck Point Road - entire street

Fairfield Avenue – entire street

Pocano Avenue – Comanche Drive to eastern terminus

Seawaneka Avenue - northern section

Pemberton Avenue - Oceanport Avenue to East Main Street

For the 2022 budget, the following streets (a total of approximately 1.7 miles) are going to be addressed:

Comanche Drive Phase 3 – Mohican to Pocahontas

Belmar Avenue - entire street

Driveway (yes, that is the name of the street!) – entire street

Manitto Place - Itaska to Winhar

Horseneck Point – east of the railroad tracks

Tohicon Place - entire street

Seneca Place - Itaska to Winhar


Sagamore - Port Au Peck to Comanche

Oceanport's governing body is committed to making our streets safe, functional and aesthetically pleasing and our fiveyear road program is designed to meet these goals.

#### **Roadway Closure – Detours**

There will be a 3-week closure of Oceanport Ave – between Main Street and the east gate entrance to Fort Monmouth/County Road 537.

Oceanport Avenue will be closed to all traffic between Main Street and the East Gate entrance to Fort Monmouth/County Road 537 beginning Monday, March 28th for approximately three weeks due to repairs of the bridge over Oceanport Creek.

Detours will be in place at Oceanport Avenue, Main Street, County Road 537 through the Fort, and East Main Street in Oceanport. The detour route will also utilize HWY 7 (Broad Street), Highway 35, and County Road 537 in Eatontown. Motorists are urged to use HWY 35, Seven Bridges Road, or Ocean Avenue as alternate routes for north/south travel within the area. Please allow for extra time when travelling in the area and follow all posted detours.

# Be Prepared for Hurricane Season!

Hurricane season is June 1st to November 30th and will be upon us soon shortly. The Oceanport Emergency Management (OEM) asks all residents to take the time to sign up for Code Red, so you will get important messages from the OEM in the event of severe weather, emergency situations, or critical community alerts related to Borough operations.

For Code Red enrollment, please go to the Oceanport Borough website at oceanportboro.com. Then go to Departments and slide down to OEM. That will take you to the OEM page. On that page will be the Code Red logo. Click on the logo and the enrollment form will appear. Here you can start an account to that will allow you access to modify your existing notification settings and contact information. You may also further customize the types of notifications you receive and add an additional address.

Another important information tool is Know Your Zone. Know Your Zone is a public education campaign implemented by the Monmouth County Office of Emergency Management and Oceanport Emergency Management. It informs residents, businesses, and visitors of Monmouth County of the new hurricane evacuation zones and their vulnerability to storm surge. The Know Your Zone campaign was developed in partnership with the municipal emergency management coordinators within the coastal towns and is based on the threat, strength direction, and forecasted storm surge of an impending hurricane, nor'easter or other coastal flooding event. The campaign also reflects the National Hurricane Center's (NHC) decision to separate the association of storm surge inundation from the category of storm. Evacuation Zones should not be confused with flood zones. Evacuation zones are based on storm surge values using various hypothetical storm models bases on worst case scenarios. Zones are established based on threat strength direction and storm surge. Knowing your zone in advance of a storm is critical to your survival.

Simply input your address and information about your zone will appear.

Ready.Gov is offered by FEMA and it provide you with how to Be Ready, Plan Ahead for Disasters and Talk with your family. It even has a Kids Page. On the OEM pages there is even information of Preparing Your Pets for Emergencies.

Please take some time to review the information and be prepared for the upcoming hurricane season!

We've got lots of home improvements in progress in Oceanport and our residents should be aware of Oceanport's new Home Improvement Program. This is a wonderful opportunity provided by the Borough for homeowners to obtain financial assistance for eligible repairs or replacement of major systems (e.g., roof, electric, heating and plumbing). There is no cost to apply. There are no credit checks. There are no monthly payments. This program provides for an interest-free, forgivable loan. The Borough of Oceanport has retained Community Grants, Planning & Housing, LLC (CGP&H), a consulting firm specializing in these types of programs, to administer Oceanport's Home Improvement Program. Please visit hip.cgph.net to learn more and to submit an easy, online pre-application. If you have questions about how to qualify under the program's parameters, or if you do not have internet access, you may call the administrator at 609-664-2783. The deadline to submit your pre-application is June 15, 2022. All pre-applicants will be entered into a computerized random lottery drawing to determine the order in which full application packages will be distributed for the available openings. This program is funded via the Borough's affordable housing trust fund.

Nice weather means that more people, most notably kids and Buddy Brocklebank, will be using our recreational facilities and taking walks along our Borough's throughfares. As such, please be reminded to SLOW DOWN when you are driving in Oceanport! Our police department is, once again, going to be committing resources to combat this scourge throughout the spring and summer months. Speeders will be stopped and they will be ticketed. But our police can't be everywhere, and we know that a great deal of the speeding in town is done by Oceanport residents. Please help us help ourselves by SLOWING DOWN while you are driving in Oceanport. Remember, speed "limits" set the upper end of the range at which vehicles can operate. The law doesn't say you HAVE to drive at the speed of the posted speed limit, it merely states that you are violating the law if your vehicle is moving in excess of the posted speed limit. For once, I would love to start receiving complaints about how slowly people are driving in Oceanport. There is no shame associated with driving 18 or 20 or 22 miles an hour in a 25 mile an hour zone. Indeed, give what's at risk, people's lives, it is something drivers should be lauded for. So, how about this: I will buy a quart of ice cream the first 25 people our police department spots driving UNDER the speed limit. I just hope I don't end up eating all 25 quarts.

# **POLICE NEWS**

#### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM THE OCEANPORT POLICE

#### **Traffic Safety**

➤ Drivers are reminded to watch your speed when travelling within the Borough. Oceanport Police Officers continue to conduct radar enforcement details throughout the Borough. Sign board and radar display boards will be placed in targeted locations to educate drivers and slow them down. Residents with speeding complaints are asked to please call the Oceanport Police Department at (732) 222-6300.

#### **Crime Prevention**

➤ The Oceanport Police reminds residents to lock your vehicles, remove key fobs and valuable items from within your parked vehicles. The OP Police continue to respond to vehicle burglaries and vehicle thefts and it continues to be a problem in our community. It only takes a second to lock your car. Do not give the criminals the opportunity to steal your car and place other people at risk. If you see someone or something suspicious in your neighborhood, please call the police at (732) 222-6300, or if the matter is serious in nature call 911. (An active car burglary, theft in progress...etc.)

#### **Properly Discard Prescription Drugs**

➤ The Oceanport Police Department will be participating in the annual National Prescription Drug Take Back Day which will be held on Saturday, April 30th, from 10:00 AM - 2:00 PM. The National Prescription Drug Take Back Day aims to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposing of prescription drugs, while also educating the public about the potential for abuse of medications. Residents are encouraged to discard

their old and unused prescription medication by dropping them off at the Drug Drop-off Box located in the foyer of the Oceanport Police Department at 930 Oceanport Way. **These prescription drugs can be dropped off anytime during normal business hours**. Liquids and needles (sharps) will not be accepted.

#### **Opioid Use and Abuse**

The opioid epidemic continues to inflict a staggering toll on our citizens of Monmouth County. In 2021 there were 174 reported fatal overdoses in Monmouth County and 956 Naloxone (Narcan) administrations. The Oceanport Police Department has partnered with the Monmouth County Prosecutors Office in Operation Helping Hands which allows officers to pass along recovery and support services information to those who have overdosed as well as the families of those affected by opioid use/abuse. Officers will also "leave behind" Naloxone spray (Narcan) to those who have suffered from an overdose.

The following is a listing of services available to those in need:

- Recovery Advocates for The Shores (RAFTS), in partnership with Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office's Operation Helping Hand Program, is offering 24/7 telephone peer recovery services
- 1-833-2B-SOBER (Press 1 for a recovery coach)
- RAFTS connects individuals to CPC Behavioral Healthcare, which provides virtual intake and counseling. To contact CPC Behavioral Healthcare directly, call: 800-250-9811.
- Monmouth County Prosecutor's Office's Operation Helping Hand Program is offering a 24/7 Helpline at 1-833-OHH-CARE (1-833-644-2273).
