#### Mayor's Message

The weather is getting warmer and I am happy to announce that Oceanport's residents and Action Campers will have a place to swim this summer because the Red Bank Community YMCA has agreed to take over operations of the Oceanport Swim Club at Blackberry Bay Park! The entire governing body is incredibly excited to have the YMCA as the operator of both the pool facility and the concession stand and we hope the 2017 season is a successful one.

The summer season is when we are reminded of how special it is we live in a town like Oceanport. Monmouth Park opened its doors for live racing on May 13th and there are special events --- food trucks, classic cars, seafood, wine and chocolate, Irish, Italian, Latino, and craft beer festivals, just to name a few --- scheduled there nearly every weekend this summer. #### Pooper Scooper Law, Dog Barking, & Dog Walking Etiquette

Please note Oceanport has a pooper scooper law in effect. If you do not clean up after your dog, a summons will be issued. This includes not only private property, but in Oceanport's parks too. Residents walking their dogs on sidewalks should be considerate of other people's property.

Also, all dogs are required to be kept on a leash at all times when off the premises of the owner's property. This includes when you have your dog at Oceanport's parks as well.

Oceanport has a Noise Nuisances ordinance which applies to habitual dog barking. Please keep your dog's barking to a minimum and be considerate to your neighbors especially during early mornings and later in the evening. Ask yourself, why would my neighbors want to hear my dog continually bark?

#### **Grass Clippings**

The Borough does not provide for the disposal of grass clippings. Grass can be recycled by leaving clippings on the lawn when you mow. Grass clippings can also be brought a third party source such as the County Reclamation Center in Tinton Falls.

#### Please be aware of the following:

All grass MUST be blown back onto your property.
Grass is NEVER to be blown into the streets, down storm drains, or into our waterways.

#### **Branches**

Please tie and bundle all branches and tree limbs. Three bundles can be placed at the curb each trash pickup day for that site. The trash contractor will not pick up bundles larger than three feet in diameter or in lengths exceeding five feet. This includes hedge and bush clippings.

The trash contractor shall not be required to pick up any stumps nor individual tree limbs or branches which exceed three inches in diameter.

Support this local CSA (Community Supported Agriculture) and pick up each week at the farmers market your own abundantly filled box of various fruits and vegetables as well as a bouquet of fresh flowers when in season. For every order placed Laurino Farms will donate \$50 to the Oceanport First Aid Squad!

#### **How the CSA Program Works**

In a CSA the customer's order helps prepay for a share of the seasons harvest. The vegetables and fruit are grown in over 40 acres of a wide range of crops with three generations of experience in farming so there is little risk that you will not be pleased with this offering from Laurino Farm. As a prepaying member, you will benefit by receiving more than double, sometimes triple, the dollar amount if you shopped outside the program. With your order you are getting locally grown New Jersey fresh produce!

#### What to Expect in a Share

Your share will likely include up to 15 items each week. In July expect corn, blueberries, zucchini, yellow squash, cucumbers, string beans and more! In August, Jersey beefsteak tomatoes are in full swing as well as beautiful ripe Jersey peaches. Along with everything mentioned cantalope, honey dews, and watermelon will be in! While most veggies persist in September the Jersey apple season begins with 5+ varieties including gala, fuji, red delicious, and golden delicious. Also, apple cider, acorn, and butternut squash abound. Please know that weather permitting, the farm should still have sweet corn in September.
