Mayor's Message

We had a fabulous summer here in Oceanport and it was closed out by another incredible Summer's End event at Blackberry Bay Park. Once again, Oceanport's Parks & Recreation Committee put together a perfect evening for all of us to enjoy and the closing fireworks display was, as usual, second to none. We owe a debt of gratitude to the paid staff and volunteers who put this event together every year. It is a town wide celebration of all that is wonderful about Oceanport.

One of the other wonderful things about Oceanport is our commitment to helping others and the Kortney's Challenge 2 Mile Fun Run/Walk at Monmouth Park on August 4th was Oceanport at its finest. With over 650 people participating in the race and hundreds more volunteering and participating in the fund-raising portion of the event, this year's Challenge met its goal of raising \$100,000.00 for research and education related to the treatment of pediatric brain and central nervous system tumors. Kudos to Oceanport, the Kortney Rose Foundation, the Gillette family and everybody who volunteered or participated in this event.

Looking ahead, as most of you are aware, the Borough of Oceanport is relocating its Municipal Complex to a 13.25-acre parcel of land on the old Fort Monmouth property located just off Main Street by the Razor Drive entrance to the Fort. Demolition work has begun on certain of the buildings there and the renovation of the remaining buildings will begin shortly thereafter. When the project is complete (we hope to be done by the third quarter of 2020), our police station will be moved from its current site at the old Fort Monmouth firehouse to the former State Police building and next door to that will be our Municipal Building. The new Municipal Building will house Oceanport's Municipal Court, our Department of Municipal Works office and all the municipal services currently located 315 East Main Street. The Department of Public Works' maintenance building and yard are already located at the site. All in all, the new complex will allow for "one stop shopping" for our citizens when completed.

Recreation soccer has started up again at Blackberry Bay Park and that means we need to be reminded that the speed limit on Port-Au-Peck by Blackberry Bay is 25 miles an hour, not 150 miles an hour. In fact, the top speed limit on ALL but three of the municipality's streets is 25 miles an hour (Main Street, Port-Au-Peck past Branchport and Crescent being the three exceptions), so please slow down when you are driving through Oceanport. I know that this is a constant theme in my messages, but speeding is a constant problem in our town.

KORTNEY'S CHALLENGE 2 MILE FUN RUN WALK AT MONMOUTH PARK

Kortney's Challenge Continues to Grow and Raise Funding for Pediatric Brain Tumor Research Goal of \$100,000 Reached!

The Kortney Rose Foundation (KRF) is proud to announce its most successful Kortney's Challenge ever! The new venue in the Grotto Beer Garden, a new course, and with perfect weather, the 14th annual event set records with nearly 650 participants and KRF's goal of \$100,000 was met! The money raised at Kortney's Challenge at Monmouth Park benefits collaborative research efforts to find better treatments and cures for pediatric brain tumors which are the number one cause of death by disease in children. The KRF was the primary funder of the world-class Children's Brain Tumor Tissue Consortium (CBTTC) and the first of its kind pediatric genomic data cloud called Cavatica. Both are operated out of the Center for Data Driven Discovery in Biomedicine at the Children's Hospital of Philadelphia (CHOP). The funds raised from Kortney's Challenge will build upon the over \$2 million that KRF has already donated to research over the past 12 years.

A new finish area venue welcomed the largest expo area with 12 vendor tents handing out many free items. Children enjoyed attractions including tattoos, face painting, crafts, balloon animals, and games. Many enjoyed lunch at the Grotto Beer Garden, attended the Day at the Races picnic event and stayed for Race #2 which was run in the honor of The KRF. All of the jockeys in this race wore pink helmet covers to signify the foundation's colors of pink and purple. Trophies were awarded to nine males and nine females in three age categories for the race. Congratulations to Oceanport's Zoe Taboada who finished 3rd place in 12 & Under Females and Sue Torchia who finished in 1st place in Women's Masters.

The KRF would not be able to hold this annual event without the generous support of Pink Rose Partners - Monmouth Park Racetrack and Turning Point Restaurants, many other generous sponsors as well as its over 650 participants. This year there were a record number of teams which also helped boost participation. KRF held its first Kortney's Challenge 14 years ago and in that time the event as raised over \$500,000 for pediatric brain tumor research. 



Leaf Collection Guidelines & Schedule



To serve residents better, leaves will be picked up four different times in each zone. Please refer to the street listing to see what zone your street is in and mark your calendars with your leaf pickup weeks.

When can I put out my leaves? Leaves can go out the weekend before your pick up week and must be out no later than Monday of your week. This allows residents (or their landscaper) two weekends to get leaves out for their pick up week. If someone services your property other than yourself, please be sure they have registered with the Borough as a copy of the schedule below is mailed to all registered landscapers every September.

Leave Collection Guidelines

1. **LEAVES ONLY to be placed at the curb. And should be free of branches, stones, hay, and other debris.** These items make it difficult for vacuum to pick up the leaves. More importantly, the flying debris can cause injury to the

Public Works employees and can also damage equipment. Any piles that contain such debris will be left behind, not cleaned up, and you will receive a notice.

2. Please keep piles straight, neat, and in the street as close to the curb as possible. Try not to make the piles any larger than four feet wide and four feet high if possible. Please be careful not to block off too much of the road with your piles. Cars must go around these piles sometimes going into the oncoming lane which can cause accidents. Cars also tend to drive through these piles scattering leaves all over the road which can create hazardous road conditions when it rains.
3. Do not place leaf piles on top of storm drains. This will impede proper storm water runoff and create flooding in the roadways. The leaves get inside the catch basin the will eventually clog pipes. Also, if you live on a corner lot, please try to place leave piles on the street that

has less traffic.

4. Please remember the Public Works Department does not pick up branches or sticks. The garbage contractor will pick up 3 tied and bundled branches and tree limbs each trash pickup day for that site. For bundles to be picked up they must be tied and bundled and not to exceed 5 feet long by 3 feet in diameter piles. The garbage collector will also take branches placed in garbage can as long as they do not stick out of the can and the can is able to be dumped easily and not jammed in. Contractor is not required to pick up any tree stumps nor individual tree limbs or branches that exceed 3 inches in diameter.

Longtime Oceanport Rick McKenna recently stepped down as a member of the Shore Regional High School Board.
